GREAT OCEAN ROAD & SILO ART

18 - 26 APRIL

Day 1: Monday 18th April 2022

Dubbo ~ Wagga Wagga ~ Albury ~ Wangaratta

Are you ready to explore Victoria's fascinating colonial past, with a great group of people? Board the luxury Langley's coach and travel south via the Newell and Olympic Highways. Pass into Victoria at Albury, to continue on to tonight's lovely accommodation at Wangaratta.

Day 2: Tuesday 19th April 2022

Wangaratta ~ Queenscliff ~ Skenes Creek

On Day 2, we travel through Geelong to the coastal town of Queenscliff, nestled on the Bellarine Peninsula. Queenscliff Harbour is the starting point for all sorts of seaborne adventure! Originally a fishing village, Queenscliff soon became an important cargo port, servicing steamships trading in Port Phillip Bay. It went on to hold an important military role, with Fort Queenscliff being built between 1879 and 1889, and operated as the command centre for a network of forts. This afternoon, we travel beneath the Memorial Arch at Eastern View that signifies the eastern end of the Great Ocean Road - a really special part of our tour. Follow the Great Ocean Road west through Lorne, Separation Creek and Kennet River to the final destination for the day and accommodation for the next 2 nights at Skenes Creek. An idyllic township on a popular surf beach, at Skenes Creek you can hunt for shells, take a stroll along the beach or enjoy a lovely picnic.

Day 3: Wednesday 20th April 2022

Skenes Creek ~ Cape Otway ~ Otway Treetop Adventure ~ Skenes Creek

This morning we travel to Cape Otway for a guided tour of the Lightstation precinct including the Aboriginal Talking Hut. Your guide will take you back to the Cape's fascinating Indigenous culture, sharing stories about the history, nearby shipwrecks, the secret World War 2 activity, and the engineering feats of the first telecommunications cable from the Mainland to Tasmania in the 19th Century. Continue on to the iconic Otway Fly Treetop Adventure to walk the 600 metre long, 25 metre high elevated walkway that provides unrivalled views of the unique beauty of the region's flora and fauna, from the rainforest floor up into the soaring heights of the treetops. Return to your accommodation for a chance to freshen up and unwind, before dinner at the motel.

Day 4: Thursday 21st April 2022

Skenes Creek ~ 12 Apostles ~ Warrnambool

Today is your day to explore the many iconic locations of this world famous coastal drive. Though they may be called the 12 Apostles, this name can be somewhat misleading as there are only 8 pillars left standing. Now is the time to see them, because unfortunately the Apostles and the nearby cliff faces are eroding at a rate of 2cm each year. If you take a closer look at the pillars, you will notice that they are made up of many different layers of limestone. It really is a rare insight into nature doing its thing! *(Please let your friendly Langley's staff know at the time of booking if you wish to include the optional helicopter flight)*. Travel further along the majestic coast to London Bridge, which collapsed in 1990 leaving two people stranded on the newly formed island. Along the way take in The Sentinel, Two Mile Bay and Point Hesse. Continue exploring the remainder of the Great Ocean Road on your way to today's destination and accommodation for the next 2 nights at gorgeous Warrnambool.

Day 5: Friday 22nd April 2022

Warrnambool ~ Flagstaff Hill ~ Sound & Light Show ~ Warrnambool

Today we visit Flagstaff Hill Maritime Village with Australia's richest shipwreck collection, all contained in an 1870's village located on a state heritage listed site overlooking Lady Bay. The afternoon is yours to spend as you wish! Take in the local artworks, explore the history and heritage or dine at the restaurants that pride themselves on high quality, locally produced ingredients. Tonight includes dinner before returning to Flagstaff Hill for the spectacular sound and light show. Step inside the village to experience dramatic stories of Australia's rich maritime history, told vividly through the multimillion dollar Sound and Light Show. Tales of the Shipwreck Coast takes you on a journey through the ages. From local aboriginal stories to the colourful whaling past then to events that gave the coastline a reputation that inspired fear and trepidation among mariners.

Day 6: Saturday 23rd April 2022

Warrnambool ~ Port Fairy ~ Warrnambool

This morning, travel to Port Fairy, a charming fishing village at the end of the Great Ocean Road. The last destination on Victoria's famed Shipwreck Coast, Port Fairy boasts beautiful wide streets lined with 19th century cottages, great Norfolk pines and old stone churches. This afternoon we visit the Sir Reginald Ansett Transport Museum that is based on the Ansett company's first aircraft hangar. Centrepieces of the display are a Fokker Universal aircraft, similar to the one used on the first Ansett flight in 1936, and the 1928 Studebaker.



Day 7: Sunday 24th April 2022

Warrnambool ~ Rupanyup ~ Sheep Hills ~ Horsham

Today we have a real treat for you. Say farewell to the Great Ocean Road as we head to the newly developed Silo Art Trail. Set in the state's remote north-west Wimmera Mallee region, the trail acknowledges the region's history as an important wheat growing area and honours its locals through a series of remarkable, large-scale portraits painted by a team of local and international artists. It truly is something to behold. Our tour includes a visit to Rupanyup to view Juli Volchkova's newly completed work on the still operational grain silos. Continue onto Sheep Hills to see a mural dedicated to Indigenous culture and knowledge, which features Wimmera Elders Ron Marls and Regina Hood. The mural is about passing culture and knowledge from generation to generation. Continue to Horsham to settle into your charming accommodation for the night.

Day 8: Monday 25th April 2022

Horsham ~ Brim ~ Rosebery ~ Lascelles ~ Patchewollock ~ Balranald

After a delicious breakfast, travel the remainder of the Silo Art Trail starting at the small farming town of Brim that captured the world's attention in January after Brisbane street artist Guido Van Helten painted a giant mural on the town's disused grain silo. Travel to Rosebery and Lascelles to view the two newest additions painted by Kaff-eine and Rone. Pause for a classic counter feed at the Minapre Hotel in Lascelles, before viewing the final silo at Patchewollock. Continue your way on to Balranald, where we stay for the night.

Day 9: Tuesday 26th April 2022

Balranald ~ Dubbo

An early start today as you travel across the Hay Plain and on to Hay that grows a wide variety of fruit and vegetables with lettuce, pumpkins, tomatoes, garlic, corn, rockmelons, watermelons and broccoli among them. Continue on the Newell Highway through West Wyalong, Parkes and Forbes and finally, home sweet home.

Luggage Limits and Clothing

Only one medium suitcase 65cm (26 inch) long x 45cm (18 inch) wide x 25cm (10 inch) deep and 15 kgs (33 lbs) in weight per person with a small bag to take on the coach. Luggage limit for some tours is available on request, phone Langley's.

Our coaches are fitted with overhead racks for your personal effects. Clothing should be casual, with lighter clothing necessary for the tropics and warmer clothes for the southern areas, especially for some nights. Bring swimmers, towel, hat, sunglasses, insect repellent, sensible walking shoes, warm jacket and an extra supply of all camera needs.

Motels

Your comfort is important so we select the best motels available and all** the rooms have private facilities. Most motels are licensed, centrally located with swimming pools and laundries. **Facilities in remote areas may be less elaborate and may not have private facilities.

Meals

Every morning we start with a full Australian breakfast of fruit juice, cereal or fruit, a cooked dish, toast and coffee and tea. Except for special occasions, lunch is not included as individual preferences vary so much. Dinner is two or three course, some evenings free for dinner of own choice.

Smoking and Alcohol

Government regulations forbid smoking and alcohol consumption in and on tourist coaches, however frequent stops provide the opportunity for those who desire to smoke.

Fares

All coach tour fares in this brochure are guaranteed and not subject to increase, other than any new Government Taxes, air, sea or rail services, over which we have no control! Fares can be found in the fare box for each tour and include accommodation on a twin/double share basis, breakfast and most dinners and all sightseeing, cruises and inspection fees as per itinerary. Overseas departure taxes are included unless stated otherwise but may be subject to change.

Fares Do Not Include

Lunch, morning and afternoon teas and occasional dinners (except where indicated as included on itinerary) and all items of a personal nature such as laundry, telephone calls, drinks and items of an emergency nature.

Single Supplement

A limited number of these are available on most tours.

Travelling Alone

Where a single passenger is willing to share accommodation with a fellow single passenger the company will endeavor to find another of the same gender, however if no suitable companion can be arranged, single supplement must be paid. The Company otherwise accepts no responsibility of the rooming partner and it is a condition of travel that the single passengers willing to share accommodation, accept the rooming partners allocated by the Company. If a passenger at any time during the tour considers the rooming partner to be unsuitable the Company will, subject to availability and at additional cost to the passenger, arrange single accommodation.

Booking Procedure

A deposit is required as indicated on booking. Final payment due one month prior to departure unless indicated on individual itineraries. Please contact us or your travel agent. Travel agents can forward deposits and other payments on your behalf, but are not the Company's agent purpose of receipt of monies. Receipt of deposit and/or payment by the travel agent does not constitute receipt by the Company and the Company is not liable in respect of monies paid to your travel agent, until monies are received by the Company. It is a condition of carriage that a passenger has paid all tour monies prior to the departure date. The Company will not be bound by any representation reported to have been made on their behalf, unless the representation is confirmed by the Company.

Itinerary

The Company reserves the right to alter or change the accommodation, carriers or coaches at any time for any reason. It also has the right to cancel/alter the itinerary and/or tour without notice as may be found necessary for any reason whatsoever including, but not limited to road, weather or traffic conditions, non performance of suppliers, industrial action, operational conditions and requirements. All additional expenses incurred as a result of any delays, cancellations or alterations will be the sole responsibility of the passenger. Whilst the Company will take all reasonable steps to provide an enjoyable tour, the Company accepts no liability for any loss of enjoyment whatsoever and howsoever experience by the passengers.

Minimum Numbers Policy

All tours are subject to minimum numbers for tour to operate.

Coach Seat Rotation

For the enjoyment of all travelers the Company operates a daily seat rotation system which all travelers must participate in as a condition of booking. (On selected tours)

Cancellation Policy
