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Day 1: Monday 13 August 2018 D Dubbo ~ Kiama

This morning we depart Dubbo and embark on our tour of the South Coast. We stop for morning tea before continuing on to travel along the famous Sea Cliff Bridge. Opened in December 2005 this 665 metre bridge is a highlight along the Grand Pacific Drive and has become an icon of Wollongong and the world. The Sea Cliff Bridge is a picturesque place to stretch your legs and is a great viewing platform for migrating whales heading North or South during Migrating season, so be sure to keep an eye out for any of the stunning beasts.

This afternoon after checking into our accommodation in Kiama, you have free time to do as you please before we enjoy our first dinner together at our accommodation.



Day 2: Tuesday 14 August 2018 BD Kiama ~ Eden

After breakfast this morning we visit the Kiama Blow Hole which is the town's major tourist attraction. Under certain sea conditions, the blowhole can spray water up to 25 meters in the air in quantities that thoroughly drench people standing by. We continue onto Eden, and hop on board our Cat Balou Cruise for a 2 hour highlights cruise of stunning Twofold Bay. The cruise highlights the history of this whaling port including Boyd's Tower, Seahorse Inn at Boydtown, Edrom Lodge and whaling station sites. The naval/multi purpose wharf, woodchip mill, mussel farms, Quarantine Bay and the fishing fleet are also viewed. After our cruise we check into our accommodation for the next few nights before enjoying dinner at our accommodation.

Day 3: Wednesday 15 August 2018 BLD Eden ~ Merimbula ~ Eden

This morning we travel to Merimbula where we visit the Merimbula Aquarium which features a 70,000 litre Oceanarium with 28 tanks featuring local and tropical marine life of all kinds. After our adventure below the water, we venture up and go for an

adventure above the water, embarking on a Discovery Boat tour with a BBQ lunch included. This afternoon after our cruise, you have a bit of free time in Merimbula to have a wander around before we board our coach and return to our accommodation in Eden for dinner.

Day 4: Thursday 16 August 2018 BLD Eden ~ Bega ~ Tathra ~ Eden

This morning after breakfast, we travel to Bega, famously known as the home of Bega Cheese. We visit the Bega Cheese Heritage Centre where you can have some morning tea, taste some cheese and wander through the 'History of Dairy' Museum upstairs which showcases the history of dairying in the Bega Valley since the early 1900's. The collection has been built from donations or purchasing collections from local farms. The display of early pieces of dairy memorabilia give a glimpse into the way the dairy industry not only established itself as a major industry in the area but also a way of life then and now for so many of Bega's residents. Don't fill yourself up too much, as next we travel to Mimosa Winery, where you have the chance to do some wine tasting and maybe purchase a bottle that you can enjoy while you have lunch as today lunch is included at Mimosa Winery. Owned by Glenn and Gail Butson who moved to the property around 30 years ago, Mimosa Wines was named after the national park that runs along the coastal side of the highway and holds magnificent cliffs, waterfalls and perfect beaches and is tucked away in the coastal valley between rugged mountain ranges.

After filling up on lunch, we drive to Tathra where you can wander down to the wharf or just look at the spectacular views of the lookout points around the headland, you may even spot some whales! This afternoon we head back to our accommodation to freshen up before dinner which is served at our accommodation.



Day 5: Friday 17th August 2018
Eden

This morning travel to the Eden Killer Whale Museum and meet "Old Tom" who was thought to be the leader of a pod of killer whales that helped whalers of the time by herding baleen whales into Twofold Bay. The killer whales would help kill the whales; in return, the whalers allowed the killer whales to eat the tongue and the lips of the baleen whales, an agreement known as the Law of the Tongue. You will have some free time to have a bite to eat for lunch (own expense) before hopping back on board the coach for a sightseeing tour of the area, taking in the places by land, that we saw from our Cat Balou cruise by sea. Whilst on our sightseeing tour, we will enjoy a spot of Devonshire Tea at the stunning Seahorse Inn. Once your bellies are full from scones and cream, we will return to our accommodation to freshen up before having dinner at our accommodation.



Day 6: Saturday 18 August 2017
Merimbula

This morning after breakfast, we travel to Wheelers Oyster Farm for a guided tour and tasting of their beautiful Sydney Rock Oysters farmed in the pristine Merimbula Lake. Today is a little more slow placed so we have some time to visit Oaklands Barn which was first settled by the Imlay brothers originally called "Pambula Station" in 1833. Over the years, the Oaklands farm has been used to farm cattle for beef production, a dairy herd for milk, cheese and butter production, sheep for wool and fat lambs and pigs for pork production and curing bacon. The farm has also been used to grow wheat, maize, sweet corn, potatoes, pumpkins, turnips and a vast fruit orchard. You have some free time here to wander the shops and different services they have on site. We will return to our accommodation in the afternoon for some free time in Eden before dinner at our accommodation.

Day 7: Sunday 19 August 2017
Eden ~Cooma~ Canberra

This morning we depart Eden and travel to Cooma to visit the Snowy Hydro Discovery Centre. This state-of-the-art visitor facility showcases the amazing history of the Snowy Mountains Scheme; from the early days of construction through to how it is operated by Snowy Hydro today. The Centre houses a comprehensive exhibition hall including an extensive photographic collection, models, hands-on exhibits and interactive displays. You will find

information about the Scheme such as engineering, the environment, the National Electricity Market, history, water management and power generation. Take your turn on the "power bikes" and see if you can peddle hard enough to power a TV, make some toast or boil a kettle.

We head back into Cooma for some free time to wander and have a bite to eat, before boarding our coach again and travelling to Canberra and to our accommodation for the evening. Dinner tonight will be served at our accommodation.



Day 8: Monday 20 August 2017
Canberra ~ Dubbo

Your Coach

Luggage Limits and Clothing

Only one medium suitcase 65cm (26 inch) long x 45cm (18 inch) wide x 25cm (10 inch) deep and 15 kgs (33 lbs) in weight per person with a small bag to take on the coach. Luggage limit for some tours is available on request, phone Langley's.

Our coaches are fitted with overhead racks for your personal effects. Clothing should be casual, with lighter clothing necessary for the tropics and warmer clothes for the southern areas, especially for some nights. Bring swimmers, towel, hat, sunglasses, insect repellent, sensible walking shoes, warm jacket and an extra supply of all camera needs.

Motels

Your comfort is important so we select the best motels available and all** the rooms have private facilities. Most motels are licensed, centrally located with swimming pools and laundries. **Facilities in remote areas may be less elaborate and may not have private facilities.

Meals

Every morning we start with a full Australian breakfast of fruit juice, cereal or fruit, a cooked dish, toast and coffee and tea. Except for special occasions, lunch is not included as individual preferences vary so much. Dinner is two or three course, some evenings free for dinner of own choice.

Smoking and Alcohol

Government regulations forbid smoking and alcohol consumption in and on tourist coaches, however frequent stops provide the opportunity for those who desire to smoke.

Fares

All coach tour fares in this brochure are guaranteed and not subject to increase, other than any new Government Taxes, air, sea or rail services, over which we have no control! Fares can be found in the fare box for each tour

and include accommodation on a twin/double share basis, breakfast and most dinners and all sightseeing, cruises and inspection fees as per itinerary. Overseas departure taxes are included unless stated otherwise but may be subject to change.

Fares Do Not Include

Lunch, morning and afternoon teas and occasional dinners (except where indicated as included on itinerary) and all items of a personal nature such as laundry, telephone calls, drinks and items of an emergency nature.

Single Supplement

Booking Procedure

A deposit is required as indicated on booking. Final payment due one month prior to departure unless indicated on individual itineraries. Please contact us or your travel agent. Travel agents can forward deposits and other payments on your behalf, but are not the Company's agent purpose of receipt of monies. Receipt of deposit and/or payment by the travel agent does not constitute receipt by the Company and the Company is not liable in respect of monies paid to your travel agent, until monies are received by the Company. It is a condition of carriage that a passenger has paid all tour monies prior to the departure date. The Company will not be bound by any representation reported to have been made on their behalf, unless the representation is confirmed by the Company.

Itinerary

The Company reserves the right to alter or change the accommodation, carriers or coaches at any time for any reason. It also has the right to cancel/alter the itinerary and/or tour without notice as may be found necessary for any reason whatsoever including, but not limited to road, weather or traffic conditions, non

performance of suppliers, industrial action, operational conditions and requirements. All additional expenses incurred as a result of any delays, cancellations or alterations will be the sole responsibility of the passenger. Whilst the Company will take all reasonable steps to provide an enjoyable tour, the Company accepts no liability for any loss of enjoyment whatsoever and howsoever experience by the passengers.
